June report:

The cash balance is \$1.26M. \$85K was from Illinois funds to General checking account The balance on the mortgage loan isl\$61K.

There is a \$45K operating surplus for the month of June. Property tax revenue resumed in June which accounts for this. The Social Security and IMRF funds are under water, but this will not continue as property revenues increase.

There is a surplus for the first 3 months of the fiscal year. There is a large surplus in the Ordinance & Finance sub-fund. The reason for that is that this sub-fund receives revenues such are sales tax and state income tax the other does not. The Police and Street sub-funds are in the red. Public grounds receives almost no income. Fortunately, there are few expenditures. Grant expenditures are the reason for the deficit

Water is profitable for the month and the fiscal year to date. The sewer fund is profitable for the month. The year-to-date deficit is a result of the capital expenditures in April. The trash fund is profitable for both the month and the fiscal year to date. but that is misleading. There was no invoice received for the contract with Republic Services. Normally that cost is approximately \$11K. If we had, the fund would be in a break-even position. There will be a deficit in July in as much as 2 month's invoices will be paid.
